








Jefferson Primary Care Overview

- Jefferson Primary Care provides continuous, person-centered, relationship-based care in 98 practice sites across diverse communities, to over half a million people
- As the largest primary care system in the Philadelphia area, we are a major driver of individual, community, and population health, and of health equity
- Transformation to value-based care requires intensified focus on Jefferson Primary Care and unleashes our ability to advance clinical system redesign in service to our patients, including Health Plan integration
- Growth engine for Jefferson Health as driver of ambulatory care, specialty care, and attribution




Enterprise Strategic Plan: the Health Plan Venn



- A total of 329,450 surveys were sent with 21,154 completed
- Participants were more likely to respond if they were women, white or Caucasian, or older individuals.
- There were significant differences in PCPCM score by age, sex, race, and length of years with provider.




